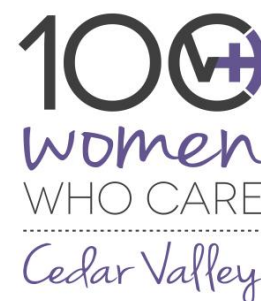


Frequently Asked Questions



Can I just send the donation to the charity myself?

The goal of the 100+ Women Who Care organization is to make a large donation on behalf of the whole group. We want to be able to support this mission and give \$10,000+ at a time. This will make a greater impact in our community, with each member's donation being part of the larger donation.

Do I have to write a check? I would like to use a credit card or cash instead.

We accept checks and also partner with OneMission Fundraising for online payments. Checks will be made out directly to the selected charity immediately following our event, and online payments will be sent directly to the selected charity at the end of the month. Visit our website to sign up for OneMission.

Can I bring a friend to the meeting?

Of course you can! However, in order to nominate or vote for charities she will need to bring a \$100 check for donation. We also prefer that all ladies sign up on our website so they can be added to our mailing list. Sign-ups will also be accepted at each quarterly event.

Is my contribution tax-deductible?

Yes, your contribution is tax deductible because it is paid directly to a 501(c)3 organization, not to 100+ Women Who Care. Each selected charity will be required to provide a receipt for your donation. Please contact your tax advisor or visit the IRS website for further information.

What is a 501(c)3 organization?

501(c)3 is defined as "exemptions that apply to corporations, and any community chest, fund or foundation, organized and operated exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, testing for public safety, literary, educational purposes, to foster national or international amateur sports competition, promote the arts, or for the prevention of cruelty to children or animals."

Once a charity receives an award, can it be considered again?

Any charity that receives an award must wait 24 months (8 meetings) before it can be nominated again.

Once a charity is presented, if it is not chosen, can it be considered again?

Yes. In fact, other chapters tell us that charities who are presented to the group but not awarded the donation often win the second or third time they are presented. Persistence pays.
